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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Govt. College Haripur was established in the year 2006 by the Govt of Himachal Pradesh in response to the persistent demand of the people of upper Kullu valley. In 2013, on the occasion of the inauguration of the New College building, the college was renamed as Jawaharlal Nehru Govt College Haripur. This association of the college with the founder of Modern India has encouraged setting high standards befitting the stature of the profound statesman and lover of mountains. The enrolment figure for the previous years clearly shows that the college has come as a boon particularly to the girl students who could otherwise ill afford college education at a place far away from their homes. The college is thus academically enriching the society by providing a major thrust to higher education in the region. 

#### Implementation of Flipped Classroom Practices


Jawaharlal Nehru Government College Haripur, Manali has systematically implemented the Flipped Classroom approach to strengthen teaching–learning processes and promote active student engagement. This practice was adopted to optimize classroom time and encourage students to take greater responsibility for their own learning, in alignment with the learner-centered framework of NEP-2020.


Under this approach, core academic content was shared with students before classroom interaction in the form of PDF notes, PowerPoint presentations, recorded lectures, YouTube resources, and guided reading material through digital platforms such as WhatsApp groups and online channels. Students were encouraged to study these materials independently prior to class sessions, enabling them to arrive with basic conceptual understanding and queries.

Classroom time was then utilized primarily for interactive discussions, clarification of concepts, group activities, presentations, and application-based exercises. This shift allowed faculty members to focus on facilitating learning rather than delivering one-way lectures. Students actively participated in discussions, peer learning, and problem-solving tasks, which enhanced their comprehension and communication skills.

The flipped classroom practice proved particularly beneficial in addressing diverse learner needs. Slow learners were able to revisit the shared content multiple times at their own pace, while advanced learners engaged in deeper analytical discussions during classroom interactions. Faculty feedback indicated improved classroom participation and more meaningful academic engagement.

Overall, the sustained use of the Flipped Classroom approach has contributed to better utilization of classroom time, improved student preparedness, and enhanced learning outcomes. The practice demonstrates effective integration of digital learning resources with face-to-face teaching and forms an integral part of the institution's efforts to strengthen student-centred learning.

The student members of <i>Abhiyakti</i> – the newly formed Dramatics Society – were thus introduced to the basics of theatre and stage-craft.</p> <p>The ten-day workshop began with the emphasis on respecting the stage, for instance, by taking off one's footwear before stepping on to it. This was followed by games and theatrical activities related to occupying space on the stage, switching between a variety of emotions, dramatic reading, teamwork, script-writing and building props. Auditions were also held to finalize members of the dramatic society as well as to form teams for the Group IV competitions of the HPU Youth Festival (held in Atal Sadan, Kullu from 20/11/2024 to 22/11/2024).</p> <p>Thereafter, scripts were finalized for the competitions and rehearsals began in earnest from morning to evening. The students were also engaged to make elaborate props for the same.
