

Name of Activity-Discussion Session on Caste Discrimination in the Society



Activity 2 Dated: 22-03-2024 Name of Activity- Mock Interview Sessions







Objective:

To help students of English Literature prepare for job interviews by practicing common questions, receiving feedback, and developing confidence in their interviewing skills.

1. Introduction

- Facilitator's Welcome Speech:

 - Outlined the session's agenda and set expectations for participation and engagement.
- Overview of Interview Skills:

- Conducting Mock Interviews:
 - Interview Questions: A list of common interview questions relevant to English Literature graduates, was provided to the students, such as:

Tips for Effective Mock Interviews:

- · Preparation:
 - Encouraged students to research common interview questions and practice their responses beforehand.
 - Reminded them to learn about the company or position they are "applying" for to provide contextually relevant answers.
- · Realism:
 - Created a realistic interview environment to help students get used to the setting.
 - Used a formal tone and setting to simulate actual interview conditions.
- Constructive Feedback:
 - Focussed on providing specific, actionable feedback rather than general comments. Highlighted strengths as well as areas for improvement.


